Before attaching bank statements or paystubs, <u>make sure you redact</u> (scratch out) any personal identifying information. What you include will be filed with the court and become part of a public record. Remove Social Security numbers and sensitive information!

The following page in this packet is the "Certificate of Service." This is a very important form because it shows the date that you serve copies of the Claim of Exemption from Execution form on the creditor, constable/sheriff, and garnishee (bank or employer). This date triggers how much time the creditor has to file an objection, and how long the constable/sheriff can hold onto your property, so the date that you serve is <u>very</u> important. The Certificate of Service is your proof that you served copies on a certain date.

<u>After</u> you file your completed Claim of Exemption from Execution, follow the directions below very carefully:

- (1) Make 3 copies of the completed Claim of Exemption from Execution form.
- (2) Mail or hand-deliver a copy of the Claim of Exemption from Execution form to the Plaintiff or the attorney for the Plaintiff, if there is one. The address for the Plaintiff, or Plaintiff's attorney, should be on the Writ of Execution.
- (3) Mail or hand-deliver a copy of the Claim of Exemption from Execution form to the constable or sheriff who is executing on your case. The name and address for the constable or sheriff should be on the Writ of Execution.
- (4) Mail or hand-deliver a copy of the Claim of Exemption from Execution form to the garnishee—the bank or employer who has garnished from you.
- (5) Fill out the Certificate of Service with the date that you actually served the copies and with the names and addresses of all the people and places you served in Steps 2-4.
- (6) File the Certificate of Service.
- (7) Wait 8 days after mailing to see if the creditor files an objection.
